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## **Raising a concern**

Don't turn a blind eye. If you are concerned about a potential victim of modern slavery or human trafficking, or a situation that is potentially exploitative, report it.

- Call the Modern Slavery
  Helpline on 08000 121 700
  or submit a report online
  modernslaveryhelpline.org/report
- If you believe a person is being trafficked and is in immediate danger, you should call 999 straight away
  - Report the crime toCrimestoppers on 0800 555 111 –an independent charity that givespeople the power to speak up andstop crime, 100% anonymously
- You can also report suspicions of trafficking by calling 101 or visiting your local police station

# Spotting the signs of modern slavery and human trafficking

We all have a part to play in the fight against modern slavery and human trafficking. Victims are often hidden in plain sight - when you are going about your day, here are some signs to look out for...



#### Appearance

- Indications of physical or psychological abuse
- Untreated injuries
- Looks unhygienic, malnourished or untidy
- May engage in substance misuse, such as alcohol and drugs



## **Behaviour**

- Seems anxious, agitated or withdrawn
- Appears to be under the control of someone else and reluctant to interact with others
- Avoids eye contact, appears frightened or nervous of the police
- Has relationships that are not typical e.g. a partner who is much older



### **Home life**

- Part of a group living in the same accommodation, who travel together
- Lives in unclean, cramped or overcrowded accommodation
- Few personal possessions
- Rarely interacts or appears unfamiliar with their neighbourhood or place of employment



#### Work life

- Always wears the same clothes and/or clothes that are not suitable for their job
- Dropped off/collected for work either very early or late at night on a regular basis
- Lives at their place of work
- Works very long hours, perhaps every day
