Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking: PSHE Session for Secondary Schools

An engaging, safeguarding-aligned session for students.

Modern slavery is one of the fastest growing crimes in the world and it is happening in communities across the UK.

Stamping Out Slavery is a powerful and interactive PSHE presentation delivered in partnership with Justice & Care, an international anti-slavery charity. The session raises awareness of modern slavery, helping students understand risk, recognise warning signs, and make informed, ethical choices as consumers and citizens.

An estimated 50 million people worldwide are trapped in modern slavery, including more than 122,000 victims in the UK. Education and awareness are vital in protecting vulnerable young people and preventing exploitation.

Designed to support PSHE, Citizenship and safeguarding priorities - including contextual safeguarding and exploitation awareness - this session equips students with knowledge, confidence and practical understanding to help keep themselves and others safe.

- The scale of modern slavery and human trafficking
- Common forms of slavery in the UK
- Slavery in cannabis farms
- Child exploitation in county lines
- Grooming
- How to spot the signs of slavery
- How to safely report suspicions of slavery
- How young people can make informed choices
- and take action
- What J&C is doing to tackle the issue

Session details

The sessions last 45-60 minutes and are aimed at Years 10-13, but can be adapted.
